Introduction

2006 was an *extraordinary year* for UCFV:

- Earned **top-tier marks** in the *Globe and Mail's* University Report Card for the quality of education and university experience at UCFV
- Rated **best employer** in Western Canada by Toronto's Collin Baer Group
- **Rated highest ever by students** with 97% indicating they were satisfied or very satisfied with the education they received at UCFV
- Took ownership of the single **largest section of the Canada Education Park** in Chilliwack for a new UCFV campus, including a **state-of-the-art Trades & Technology centre** that opens in September 2007
- Rallied the community to **raise \$1.25 million and launch** the Centre for Indo-Canadian Studies at UCFV, which will house the first-ever BC Regional Innovation Chair on Canada-India Business and Economic Development
- Became the **only Canadian post-secondary institution** to establish an education society – along with a new campus – in India, complementing the goals of the new Centre for Indo-Canadian Studies and further promoting opportunities for Fraser Valley businesses in India
- Successfully completed delivery of the first year of **Canada's first Master of Arts in criminal justice**, and built on our research agenda, keeping us at the forefront of all the universities in Western Canada in terms of **crime-related research**

 - Launched **research centres** focused on aging, non-profit development, and social responsibility, as well as a high-security crime research lab
 - Produced a season of theatre, a fashion show, a literary café, film festivals (including one with the UK's venerable British Museum), art and photography exhibits, and guest lectures/forums on topics such as marijuana legalization, national security, and global warming.

Our accomplishments this past year were due in large part to the efforts of our students, our employees, and the communities of the Fraser Valley.

Luminescence Dating Research Laboratory

The Luminescence Dating Research Laboratory, currently under construction, will be a state-of-the-art facility built around the most current luminescence dating system manufactured by Risø National Laboratory in Denmark. The NSERC-funded UCFV laboratory will be directed by Dr. Olav B. Lian and will serve as the western Canadian centre for luminescence dating research and student training.

The initial focus of much of the research in the new UCFV laboratory will be associated with a multidisciplinary effort to understand the geometry (shape, size, and extent) and stability of the large ice sheets that occupied much of Canada during the last and earlier glaciations, and how the landscape adjusted after the abrupt disappearance of these ice sheets. Information on these topics is crucial for understanding how fluctuations in climate might influence the stability of present-day ice sheets, the regions affected by them, and the flora and fauna that used the fringe regions as refugia. This research is in collaboration with environmental scientists and research students at University of British Columbia, Simon Fraser University, and the Royal British Columbia Museum.
