

Teacher Education Program (TEP)

Please read through the entire application package. Applicants must submit their completed application with supporting documentation, as noted below, by **January 31**. Applications received after this date may only be considered, if space is available.

APPLICATION: The following items must be submitted together starting October 1st and must be received before the application deadline of January 31st.

- UFV Application form
- UFV application processing fee \$45 (only for new students)
- Teacher Education program application form

Supporting documents:

- Official (sealed) post-secondary transcripts**
All applicants must submit official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions they have attended (excluding UFV). Transcripts must be sent directly to the UFV Admissions office from the originating institution in the original sealed envelope with the institution's name and address imprinted upon it. If these were previously sent to UFV, they don't need to be resend.
- Résumé**
Submit a 2-page résumé which outlines any of your work experiences that you consider relevant for a teaching career. For example you can give a brief summary of your post-secondary education, skills (i.e. certificates, languages), travel, and other information relevant to your application. TEP applicants are encouraged to have related experience working with children either in the classroom or other volunteer work in a B.C. public school. You should indicate the number of hours you have spent gaining this experience
- Two confidential letters of reference**
Referees have the option of using the form attached to this application (also available on the UFV TEP website), or they can write a letter in support of your application. If the letter option is chosen, questions 1 to 6 on the form must still be answered. You may submit a third reference, but no more than three are permitted. References must be mailed directly from the referee in a sealed envelope to the UFV Admissions office.
- Written assignment**
You are asked to write a 500-word statement about a specific experience in your work with children/adolescents, that speaks to your understanding of teaching and learning. Reflect upon this experience and connect it to your own beliefs about education. Be clear and concise and use your own words and language. **Please note that this assignment needs to be completed at the UFV campus. Choose and attend one of the following dates to write your statement:**
 - January 19th at 4:30pm in room C1429 Abbotsford campus
 - January 23rd at either 1pm or 4pm in room E101 Chilliwack campus
 - January 26th at 12pm in room E101 Chilliwack campus

Note: The written assignment must be completed on campus for your application to be considered complete. Once the above items have been received in the Admissions office your application package will be forwarded to the TEP admission committee for review.

PROGRAM ADMISSION CRITERIA

The Admissions Committee, comprised of the TEP department head, educational advisor, two education faculty members, and a member of the Teacher Education Program Curriculum Committee, will consider each candidate's application.

- 1) Each applicant must meet all academic requirements. The Admissions Committee will review your academic background, grades and subjects studied, is taken from your transcripts be looking for breadth of studies across all elementary curriculum areas (i.e. language arts, social studies, math, sciences, music, art, physical education).
- 2) In addition candidates are evaluated based on the five additional admission criteria
 - a. written assignment,
 - b. work experience talents and skills,
 - c. reference letters,
 - d. GPA,
 - e. academic preparation.

Each criterion will be given equivalent weight and the top candidates may be asked for an interview. A waitlist of 8 to 10 applicants will also be compiled.

- 3) A conditional acceptance may be offered to students who are still completing their Bachelor's degree and/or EDUC 300. Students in this situation must submit a letter from their faculty or institution verifying that all graduation requirements will be met before the end of April. This letter must be submitted by **January 31st**. Final proof of completion of entrance requirements is due **May 15th**.

Criminal Record Check

All students in TEP are required to undergo a Criminal Record Check, as mandated by the Criminal Records Review Program. **This is administered through the TEP office.** Persons convicted of a criminal offense and given an absolute discharge are advised to write the Registrar of the British Columbia College of Teachers for clarification of their status before undertaking a teacher education program.
