An exploration of the nature and impacts of humanitarian emergencies and humanitarian aid in the global South. Students learn to apply an anthropological perspective and use ethnographic texts to interrogate complex causes of humanitarian emergencies, encounters between humanitarian aid actors and recipients of aid, the humanitarian response, and development challenges faced by "post-conflict" countries. Note: This course is offered as GDS 330 and ANTH 330. Students may take only one of these for credit. Note: Students with credit for GDS 299C or ANTH 299H cannot take this course for further credit.
