This course provides students with the knowledge and experience needed to instruct students how to fly aircraft, and to meet the standards of the Transport Canada Class IV Flight Instructor Rating flight test. This course includes 30 sessions of dual instruction on single engine aircraft and four sessions of dual instruction on a PFC Flight Training Device. AV 452 is a full-year course.

PREREQUISITES: Admission to the BBA Aviation or the Aviation diploma, Aviation 312, Aviation 322, and a commercial licence (aeroplane) or higher
