METHODS:

Final Exam

This will be an active and interactive class where students learn by practising English in the skill areas of writing, grammar, reading, speaking and listening independently, in pairs or in groups as best suits the learning situation. The students will use computer software, Internet resources, and web-based interactive activities to learn and practise English. The teacher will utilize supplementary materials and will incorporate listening/speaking and writing activities to reinforce learning. The students will be responsible for keeping records of work completed.

STUDENT EVALUATION PROCEDURE:

Students will evaluated as follows:

In-class assignments

50%

(Includes homework assignments & computer work records)

Mid-term 20%

30%

Students require 75% to receive credit for the course.

COURSE CONTENT

Content will be adjusted to suit the needs of the students and so may vary slightly from one semester to another. Students will use a variety of computer software programs, Internet resources, interactive web-based activities, and individual or group in-class activities to learn and practice English reading, vocabulary, writing, grammar, speaking, and listening. Students will learn to develop individual responsibility for learning through record keeping, using Help sheets, following oral and written instructions, and through peer help.
