Most basic elements of the German grammar will be completed in German 102, including the nominative, accusative, dative, and genitive cases; present indicative tenses covering past, present, future time frames.

German 102 completes second half of chapter 4 and chapters 5 to 8 of the textbook Sag mal by VISTA Higher Learning.

Week 3: regular verbs in Perfekt tense (past indicative tense)
