TEXTS:

At least five novels are to be covered, including works by Defoe, Richardson, and Fielding. Other novels should be selected from the following authors: Sterne, Smollett, Austen, Scott, Dickens, Thackery, the Brontes, Hardy, Joyce, Lawrence, Woolf.

OBJECTIVES:

To study the historical development of the British novel, showing how different novelists at different times have solved (in different ways) the problems intrinsic to the novel form.

METHODS:

Lectures, discussions, and seminars on the course material.

STUDENT EVALUATION PROCEDURE:

At least five major written exercises are required, inluding examinations and critical essays. The course grades are tied closely to these.

COURSE CONTENT:

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
