COMPLETION ADVISORS **meet with students who are admitted to one of the following programs:**

- ▶ ARTS: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Arts Global Development Studies, Bachelor of Environmental Studies, Associate of Arts, Liberal Arts and Theatre diplomas
 - ▶ FINE ARTS: Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Media Arts, Visual Arts diploma, Graphic and Digital Design diploma, or future students for these programs
 - ▶ SCIENCE & CIS: Bachelor of Agricultural Science, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Computer Information Systems, Associate of Science, CIS certificate and diploma, Data Analysis Certificate (DAC), Engineering Physics diploma, Engineering Transfer program
 - ▶ Bachelor of Arts in Child and Youth Care, Early Childhood Education (certificate or diploma – including Special Needs and Infancy)
 - ▶ Bachelor of Integrated Studies, General Studies diploma
 - ▶ Bachelor of Social Work, Social Services diploma, Community Support Worker certificate, Aboriginal Cultural Language Support diploma
 - ▶ Or who have completed 30 credits and want to switch into one of the above programs
