The National Indigenous Fire Safety Council (NIFSC) Project is the result of a new Indigenous-initiated framework designed to support Indigenous communities in the development of their internal capacity to further community safety and resiliency. The NIFSC Project is Indigenous inspired, designed and led in collaboration with regional and national Indigenous communities, organizations and leaders.

Community Scan Project

Objective

The goal of this project is to compile a directory of entities within post-secondary institutions (e.g., Indigenous Student Centres, Indigenous Studies Departments) and Friendship Centres across Canada. The purpose of this directory is to aid in the NIFSC recruitment strategies and local community engagement on various projects and initiatives.

Methods

The directory is organized by province and type of organization and includes the name and description of the entity, along with contact information and a listing of digital addresses (website, email, social media) when applicable. The compiling team has sent an email to the contact person of each entity included in the directory with information about their inclusion in this directory and a brief description of the NIFSC Project and the purpose of the directory.

How to use this directory

There are two tables of contents listed before the directory entries. The first, an overview listing, provides the provinces and categories with the corresponding page number. The second table of contents is a more detailed version, with each individual entry listed under the higher-level headings. All headings and entries listed in both tables of contents are hyperlinked to their location in the document. A single click on any province, category or entry will take the user directly to that location in the directory.
