

Moving from Risk Assessment to Risk Reduction:

An Analysis of Fire-related Risk Factors in First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council Areas across Canada

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This report draws on data that is currently in place that was available for First Nations Populations on Reserve. There is a goal in moving beyond this current state and wherever possible by implementing new forms of data collection, drawing upon different data sources, and framing research questions that include Inuit and Metis populations and communities and First Nations residents off reserve.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report describes the results of an analysis of factors related to fire risk and associated injury and death in First Nation communities across Canada. This community level risk assessment was conducted using data captured in Statistics Canada's 2016 Census Aboriginal Community Portraits.¹ The data used for this analysis was aggregated at the First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area level and represents 624 communities across Canada.² The primary purpose of this report is to provide a risk analysis of on-reserve communities to assist the Aboriginal Firefighters Association of Canada (AFAC) as it collaborates and prioritizes with communities in the implementation of programs and strategies aimed at fire risk reduction.

In a study conducted by Clare et al. (2012), fire risk reduction was examined in association with the HomeSafe³ initiative focusing on *Children under 6 years*, *Individuals aged 65 and over*, *Movers*, *Lone parents*, and *Unemployed individuals*. The analysis described in this report builds on that important work by adding four additional variables: *Household condition – Major repairs needed*, *Household crowding*, *High occupancy household*, and *Rental household*.

The analysis described in this report utilizes nine variables to assess risk based on other work that has employed this type of risk matrix in support of risk reduction needs assessment and subsequent program implementation strategies. Both individual and household level variables are employed: *Children under 6 years*, *Individuals aged 65 and over*, *Household condition* – *Major repairs needed*, *Short term occupant*, *High occupancy household*, *Household crowding*, *Rental household*, *Lone parents*, and *Unemployed individuals*.

As established by other research,⁴ the results of this analysis demonstrate the potential of community-level risk-based assessments, whether Indigenous or non-Indigenous, to support strategic and targeted decision-making in relation to the implementation of risk reduction interventions. The analysis highlights the variation across communities⁵ as well as potential shared experiences with respect to the risk factors utilized in this report. Obviously, this

analysis is purely descriptive and lacks the ability to analyze risk in relation to fire incident statistics because of the absence of that data; however, as organizations such as AFAC continue to advocate, in partnership with Indigenous communities across Canada, for the systematic collection of fire statistics, it is hoped that incident data will be gathered and integrated into future analyses.


It is suggested that AFAC uses the analysis as a framework in working with local communities to establish priorities in the development and implementation of fire-risk reduction programs and strategies. As this analysis is built upon the work of others, so too can this matrix of risk factors be enhanced through the examination of other socio-economic variables, local community experiences with respect to fire risk, and ultimately fire incident data to continue to strengthen the evidence-based orientation of AFAC.





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PURPOSE

The purpose of this analysis is to support the AFAC in their work with local communities to develop evidence-based approaches to fire risk reduction in First Nation on-reserve communities in Canada. The disproportionately higher risk of fire injury and death in Indigenous communities has been well-documented with the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (2007) reporting that the "First Nations per capita fire incidence rate is 2.4 times the per capita rate for the rest of Canada. The death rate is 10.4 times greater; the fire injury rate is 2.5 times greater; and the fire damage per unit is 2.1 times greater."

This analysis utilizes existing data from Statistics Canada's 2016 Census Aboriginal Community Portraits (2020) to assist AFAC in examining community risk factors and levels in First Nation/Indian band or Tribal Council areas in Canada. This analysis builds on previous work that demonstrates the efficacy of targeting fire risk reduction interventions through the utilization of a risk matrix.

As part of the residential fire risk reduction strategy of the AFAC, this analysis will contribute to the Association's efforts to prioritize and target programs and services to serve on-reserve communities experiencing the greatest need. The risk factors employed in this analysis were selected based on the previous work and additional variables of interest identified by AFAC. The variables included are demarcated using the definitions employed by Statistics Canada and are discussed in greater depth in the methods section below.

The heightened risk for fire-related injuries and deaths among Indigenous people in Canada and beyond is well documented even in the absence of Canadian on-reserve fire-related data collection.⁷ It is critical that the complex and interconnected web of factors that contribute to this disproportionate risk is understood and operationalized in ways that reduce the fire-related risk experienced in these communities.

COMMUNITY DESIGNATIONS

First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas were used as the geographic units of analysis as they are the designations utilized in the Aboriginal Population Profiles, 2016 Census.⁸ Tribal Councils are defined as "groups made up of several First Nation communities that represents the interests of those First Nations. The Tribal Council may administer funds or deliver common services to those First Nations. Membership in a Tribal Council tends to be organized along geographic, political or cultural and linguistic lines." An Indian Band is defined as "a body of Indians for whose collective use and benefit lands have been set apart or money is held by the Crown, or who have been declared to be a band for the purpose of the Indian Act." First Nation/Indian Bands or Tribal Councils are defined using census subdivisions or designated places.¹¹

People who live in these communities do not all belong to the specific First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council; however, the variables of interest in this analysis use Indigenous identity¹² as a filter, ensuring only Indigenous representation in the data. There are a number of census subdivisions which were omitted from analysis in the province of British Columbia. This is because several census subdivisions/designated places in British Columbia are "not affiliated with a Tribal Council," and the geographical locations which are not affiliated with a Tribal Council do not have community level data available in the IVT files and therefore were not included in this analysis.¹³

SELECTION OF RISK FACTORS

As discussed above, this analysis represents an extension of previous fire risk reduction work¹⁴ with the inclusion of the additional factors related to *Household crowding*, *High occupancy household*, and *Rental household*. These additional factors have been found to be related to fire incident risk and fire-related injury and death, and support the development of this risk matrix to aid future engagement strategies with local communities. Nine risk factors employed in this analysis are defined by Statistic Canada and described as follows:

Children under 6 years: There is an abundance of literature examining the increased risk of residential fires, ¹⁵ fire-related injuries, and fire-related death for young children ¹⁶ including the mitigating potential of smoke alarms, ¹⁷ and the nature of the residential structure. ¹⁸ Provincially, the BC Coroners Service "data from 2005-2014 showed that for all ages fire is the fifth most common cause of accidental death, accounting for 2.1 percent of all deaths. For the same period, fire was also the fifth overall cause of accidental death for children and youth, accounting for just under 5 percent of all deaths." ¹⁹

Individuals aged 65 and over: The greater risk for adults aged 65 years and over has been documented extensively and has been connected to a variety of social and health-related factors (e.g. hearing a smoke alarm) associated with some older adults.²⁰ These more general factors are in some cases aggravated by living arrangements and conditions.²¹

Housing condition – **Major repairs needed:** Household condition refers to whether the dwelling needs repairs (repairs do not include desirable remodeling or additions) and response options were regular maintenance needed, minor repairs needed, and major repairs needed. The condition of residences in terms of disrepair and maintenance required has been associated with fire risk and related injuries and death²² and prevention efforts aimed at structural safety have increased in recent years.²³

Short term occupant: The inclusion of *Short term occupant* as a variable is predicated on previous research that examines residential mobility and risk in relation to fire incidents.²⁴ Statistics Canada defines Movers (referred to as *Short term occupant* in this study) as persons who have moved their place of residence in relation to the place of residence on the same date one year earlier.

Household crowding: Crowding is defined as more than one person per room in a private household. Individuals and families living in crowded residential environments have been found to be at greater risk for experiencing a residential fire.²⁵

High occupancy household: This variable indicates 5 or more persons in a household, and as noted above, individuals and families living in crowded residential environments have been found to be at greater risk for experiencing a residential fire.

Rental household: A dwelling is considered a *Rental household* if no member of the household owns the dwelling. While renting and owning motivations and experiences are diverse, rental properties and their occupants have been deemed at greater risk.²⁶

Lone parents: *Lone parents* is defined as an adult with one child living in the same household. Challenges associated with supervision and lone parenthood and child safety in relation to fire incidents have been documented by several scholars.²⁷

Unemployed individuals: Individuals are considered unemployed if they are aged 15 years or older without paid work or without self-employment work and were available for work and either (a) had actively looked for paid work in the past four weeks; or (b) were on temporary lay-off and expected to return to their job; or (c) had definite arrangements to start a new job in four weeks or less. Employment status has been found to be an important co-determinant in assessing risk by numerous authors.²⁸

DATA SET

Informed by previous work, this analysis utilized the risk factors described above to identify First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas across Canada that may be at greater risk for fire-related incidents. The data associated with these variables were drawn from two Statistics Canada IVT files. The First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas Housing file was used to extract the household level data associated with the following variables: *Household condition* (*Regular maintenance needed, Minor repairs needed, Major repairs needed*), *High occupancy household, Household crowding*, and *Rental household*. The First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas Aboriginal Identity file was used for the variables: *Children under 6 years, Individuals aged 65 and over, Short term occupant, Unemployed individuals*, and *Lone parents*.

Each First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area consists of one or more census subdivisions (CSD)/designated places. The IVT files were merged, sorted in Excel, and the raw values for each factor were converted into standardized Z scores to allow for an interpretation of the values utilizing a Z score cut-off of 1.282.²⁹ If a community met the 1.282 cut-off on any of the nine risk factor values, they were identified. In a normally distributed dataset, a Z score of 1.282 represents the 90th percentile. In keeping with the focus of this analysis as a descriptive representation of risk outliers and noting the large sample size, this cut-off was deemed appropriate for this non-normal distribution.³⁰ The ranking by province was determined using the cumulative number of selected risk factors for each First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area.

GEOSPATIAL MAPPING

After the community risk assessments were completed the results of the analysis were visualized using QGIS software. Maps were generated using the census subdivisions within the selected First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas and will aid AFAC in the strategic planning work that will be supported by this report. Boundary files for census subdivisions were downloaded from Statistics Canada and matched to the list of First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas and their associated census subdivisions/designated places. Geocodes were assigned to each at risk First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area. After assigning the geocode for the First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area for each province, boundary files for census subdivisions and the data were imported into QGIS. Maps of each province containing selected communities were created.




Looking across Canada, Table 1.1 highlights the potential impact of fire-related risk in its representation of both the number of individuals living in higher risk communities and the proportional impact based on provincial populations. Table 1.1 highlights the potential impact of fire-related risk noting that 3.37% of the 624 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas had seven or more risk factors above the threshold. Importantly, these communities represent 166,740 residents. Based on the analysis captured in Table 1.1, provincial priorities for AFAC's engagement would be Alberta, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Quebec.

These four provinces have both the most First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas identified as having more than seven risk factors selected and also the highest number of residents potentially being at risk (148,825). In fact, these 148,825 residents represent 89% of those living in all First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas having seven or more risk factors selected. These areas within each of the provinces would be meaningful starting points for local community engagement on fire-risk reduction strategies.

British Columbia, Nova Scotia, and Ontario each only had one First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council Area with seven or more risk factors selected. The rest of the provinces and territories did not have any areas that had more than seven risk factors selected.

Despite the magnitude of the potential proportional impact on residents, only six of the 25 communities in the Northwest Territories included in the analysis met the risk threshold. For five of those communities, the only risk factor selected related to *Rental household*.








Figure 1.1 - At Risk First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area in the Northwest Territories


In Manitoba, 17 of the 65 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas were selected as being above the risk threshold on at least one factor. None of these 17 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas were selected for risk on the variables related to *Individuals aged 65 and over* or *Rental household*. Five of the communities identified registered seven risk factors representing 33,720 residents.

While *Rental household* was not a risk factor for any First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas in Manitoba, 11 communities were selected to be at risk for at least two of the three other housing related variables (*Household condition – Major repairs needed*, *High occupany household* or *Household crowding*).








There were ten First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas identified as meeting the risk threshold for at least one risk factor in Saskatchewan, with one community representing 20,860 residents being selected for all nine variables. All but one of the areas in Table 2.4a reached the risk threshold for multiple factors with a total of four communities (PADC Management Company Ltd., Meadow Lake Tribal Council, Lac La Ronge Indian Band and Battlefords Agency Tribal Chiefs Inc.), representing 38,395 residents, being selected for at least seven factors. Again, the risk factor for *Individuals aged 65 and over* was only selected in one community. Nine of the ten First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas in Table 2.4a were selected on at least two of the four household level variables (*Household condition – Major repairs needed*, *High occupany household*, *Household crowding or Rental household*).





Figure 1.4 - At Risk First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area in Saskatchewan











There were sixteen First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas selected for risk factors in British Columbia, with seven of those communities having only one risk factor selected. Of the four household level variables, *Rental household* was selected in ten of the 16 communities; however, only one community was selected for any of the other three household level risk factors and that was for *Household condition - Major repairs needed*. British Columbia was the only province or territory that had a majority of their selected communities meeting the threshold of risk for *Individuals 65 years and over* with the *Children under 6 years* factor not being a primary risk category for B.C. Only 14 of the 88 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas across Canada were selected based on the variable related to *Individuals aged 65 and over* and British Columbia accounts for 11 of those 14 communities.












Figure 1.8 - At Risk First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area in New Brunswick



In Ontario only 10 of the 125 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas were selected as meeting the risk threshold on any of the nine variables. Of the 10 selected Tribal Council/Indian Band areas, seven areas had only one selected risk factor with the other three areas having between three and eight selected risk factors. All of the communities were selected for at least one household level risk factor.






Figure 1.10 - At Risk First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council area in Newfoundland and Labrador








METHODOLOGICAL LIMITATIONS

Not all Indigenous communities are included in this analysis as they were not included in the 2016 Census. Thirteen communities (four in Quebec, seven in Ontario, one in Alberta, and one in British Columbia) did not provide permission to be enumerated and one community in Ontario did not complete the enumeration process.³² Additionally, there are a number of census subdivisions which were omitted from the analysis in the province of British Columbia. This is because several census subdivisions/designated places in British Columbia are "not affiliated with a Tribal Council." The geographical locations which are not affiliated with a Tribal Council do not have community level data available in the Statistics Canada IVT files.

SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS

This report represents a descriptive analysis of the risk factors associated with fire-related incidents, injuries and deaths and provides opportunities for AFAC to collaborate with identified and other communities in designing and implementing fire prevention and risk reduction programs. In addition to the observations in the results sections, the following summary comments are noteworthy:

- ▶ There were no First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas in the Yukon, Prince Edward Island and Nunavut that were selected;
- ▶ Based on the areas included in this analysis, 21 (3.37%) of the 624 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas were selected for seven or more risk factors; and
- ▶ Across the 88 First Nation/Indian Band or Tribal Council areas there was a total of 338 selected risk factors.

While this report focuses on the variables described above, "[r]esearch over many years has demonstrated the association between residential fire incidence, the social and economic characteristics of residents, and housing and neighborhood conditions.³³ Poverty and other forms of deprivation and marginalization resulting from broader socio-economic trends, official policies, and planning decisions, generate conditions of vulnerability, contributing to poor housing quality, overcrowding, and failure to invest in protective measures.^{34,35}

The National Collaborating Centre for Aboriginal Health highlights that "Indigenous people live in households that vary in condition, composition, and location across Canada. Overall, the national picture gives evidence to this diversity while at the same time calls for action on the unsuitable, substandard and overcrowded state of the vast majority of Indigenous homes ... Currently, Inuit and First Nations on-reserve households fare the worst across all these standards in Canada."³⁶

This report provides AFAC with instructive information on next steps as it strategizes on ways to engage communities on localized approaches to fire risk reduction strategies. AFAC has been advocating for the resumption of the collection of fire-related data and we would suggest that once that occurs there are important opportunities to expand the risk factors examined. This analysis provides a foundation upon which fire incident data can be introduced as collection strategies are developed and initiated and additional factors integrated to provide an even more robust risk matrix.³⁷

There is tremendous variation in the experiences of individuals and households in relation to fire risk; therefore, the design and implementation of programs targeting communities at higher risk should be multi-sectoral, community-driven, and collaborative promoting "specialized interventions for different groups of individuals, and a demand for both human and technical solutions." The strength of the technical analysis captured in this report is it provides the foundation upon which AFAC can continue to build partnerships with Indigenous communities across Canada to explore local experiences and associated fire risk reduction needs of these communities.




Statistics Canada explains that:

In 2016, there were a total of 14 Indian reserves and Indian settlements that were incompletely enumerated. For these reserves and settlements, dwelling enumeration was either not permitted or was interrupted before it could be completed.

This represents a decrease compared to the 31 Indian reserves and Indian settlements that were incompletely enumerated in the 2011 Census. Note that in 2011, of the 31 incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and Indian settlements, 13 were not enumerated because of forest fires in Northern Ontario at the time of census collection. In 2016, there were no Indian reserves or Indian settlements that were not enumerated due to a natural disaster.

The 2016 Census population and dwelling counts are not available for the 14 incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and Indian settlements and are not included in 2016 Census tabulations. Data for geographic areas containing one or more of these reserves and settlements are noted accordingly. Because of the missing data, users are cautioned that for the affected geographic areas, comparisons (e.g., percentage change) between 2011 and 2016 may not be precise. The impact of the missing data for higher-level geographic areas (Canada, provinces, and territories, census metropolitan areas and census agglomerations) is very small. However, the impact can be significant for lower-level geographic areas (e.g., census divisions), where the incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and Indian settlements account for a higher proportion of the population. This is especially true for lower-level geographic areas where a particular Indian reserve or Indian settlement was incompletely enumerated for the 2016 Census and enumerated for the 2011 Census and vice versa.³⁹




