IMMUNIZATION	DATE RECEIVED	DOCTOR'S VERIFICATION	INFORMATION
Diphtheria			If your vaccination date is 10 years ago or more, a booster is required.
Tetanus			If your vaccination date is 10 years ago or more, a booster is required.
Polio			Polio-Salk series (by injection) as a child or Sabin series (oral vaccine). 3 doses required.
Pertussis			Current vaccination required. (Typically received in Grade 9.)
Measles	<input type="checkbox"/> Had disease		If you have had the disease, further immunization is not required.
Mumps	<input type="checkbox"/> Had disease		If you have had the disease, further immunization is not required.
Rubella immunity			If you cannot provide proof of immunization, a blood test can be done to determine immunity. If the results show an insufficient titre, you must receive the vaccine. <b>Attach a photocopy of lab results.</b>
Hepatitis B <i>2 doses required</i>			Note: Hepatitis B takes up to 9 months to complete the full cycle. Only two of the three doses are required.
Influenza	<input type="checkbox"/> Opted out of flu shot		Must be received annually for the current flu season (October-March). If you opt out of the flu shot, Fraser Health will require you to wear a mask throughout flu season.
Tuberculin skin test			If test returns positive, a negative chest x-ray is required. <b>Attach a copy of the negative skin test results.</b>
Varicella/Chicken Pox	<input type="checkbox"/> Had disease		If you have had the disease, further immunization is not required.
