The Honorable Steven Point Visits UCFV - Abbotsford Campus on January 14th

Our Province's Lieutenant Governor, Steven Point, continues his culture and traditions as they are now included in many of the ceremonies that he attends as part of his role as the Queen's representative. The honorable Steven Point, as well as an UCFV alumnus, and recipient of an honorary doctorate, and former UCFV instructor, was drummed into the boardroom at UCFV (Abbotsford campus) on Monday, January 14th by the Williams family from Skwah First Nation and a representative from Kwantlen First Nation, Lekeyten. The drum beat represents the heartbeat of our people he explains to the people who are in attendance, some are not aware of the importance of the drum beat, to not only the Sto:lo people, but all xwelmexw (First Nations) people.

The honorable Steven Point's speech was awe inspiring because he speaks from the heart as he has a powerful way of captivating his audience. As First Nations people, among the crowd of predominantly non-Aboriginal people, his words were evocative and gave us a sense of pride and reassurance that the future will change for the better for all Aboriginal people. The Lieutenant-Governor's traditional name means "Speaker of the House," a translation that moved the audience and a meaning that carries more than appropriateness, but the fate of the Aboriginal people.

NITEP is returning to Chilliwack Campus.

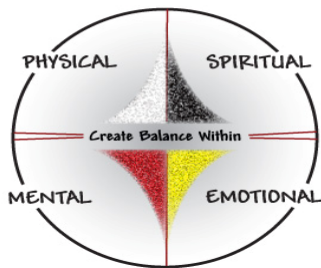

Message from our Elder:

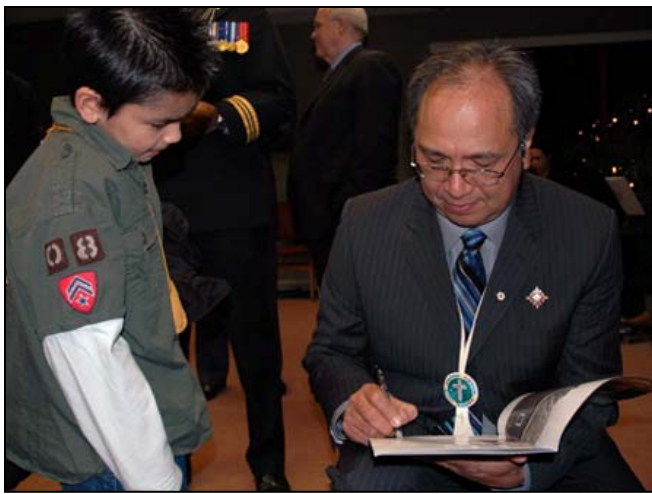

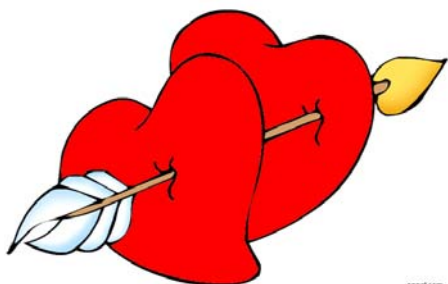
