An interesting time - June 2007

June 2007 is shaping up to be an interesting time. Seeing the world from the point of view of a xwelmexw person working at a post secondary institution is often very interesting. This month, the schedule of events upcoming for the Fraser Valley aboriginal community and at UCFV promises celebration and contemplation.

Convocation is June 14th and 15th on the Abbotsford campus. Many people receiving well earned certificates, diplomas, and degrees will be of aboriginal ancestry. All of us aboriginal people should be proud that many of our own at UCFV (and at other schools throughout the month) will be a step closer to serving the aboriginal and larger community as professionals with accredited training. Aboriginal

people know how greatly needed these success stories are for aboriginal people to hear and know.

National Aboriginal Day will be celebrated in many communities across BC and Canada on June 21st to honour the contributions of our people to Canada. There is reasoning, based on tradition, for this day being chosen in Canada. For uncountable generations, many First Nation people attended ,around the time of summer solstice, sun dances or other ceremonies. This year will mark the eleventh time the contributions of aboriginal people to the Canadian identity are acknowledged. At UCFV, Aboriginal Access Services will be hosting a National Aboriginal Day celebration on June 19th on the green at the Abbotsford campus.

Listen for the sounds and look for the colours of an aboriginal celebration.

Later in June after festivities and rejoicing, there is an event of a more sombre nature being planned. A event called the 'National Day of Action - Solidarity for Aboriginal Justice' is set for the 29th. It is gaining support at the grassroots and leadership levels. It is a day for aboriginal people to demonstrate and express the collective aboriginal vision of ending poverty within our communities.

So, although much has been accomplished and there is much to celebrate in many communities, aboriginal people know that there is still much work to do to realize the vision of ending aboriginal poverty.
