

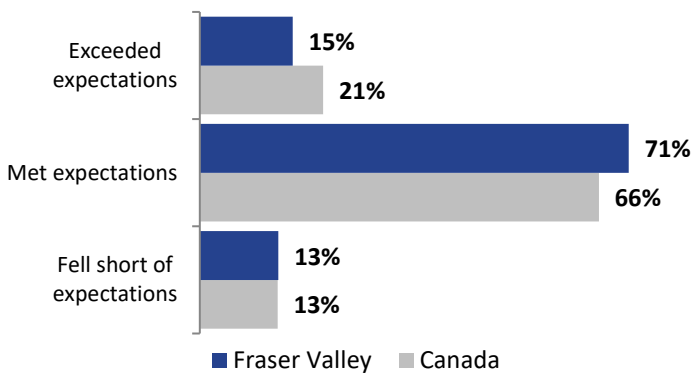
CUSC-CCREU 2019 Survey of First-Year Students: Quick Facts

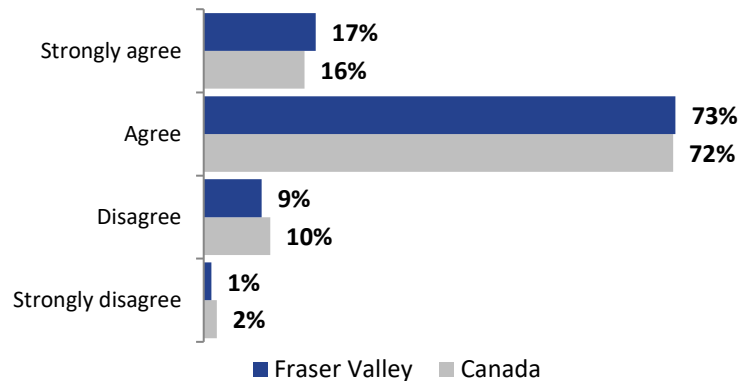
The 2019 Survey of First-Year Students was distributed to 53,028 students, resulting in feedback from 18,092 students across Canada from 46 institutions.

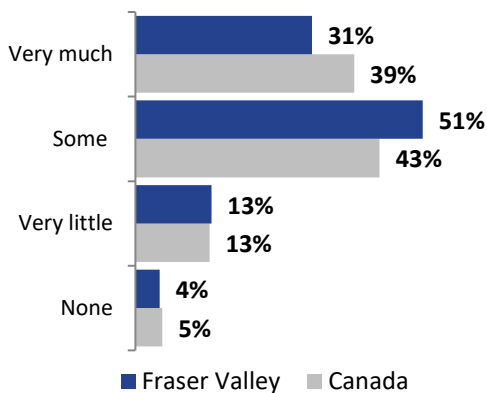

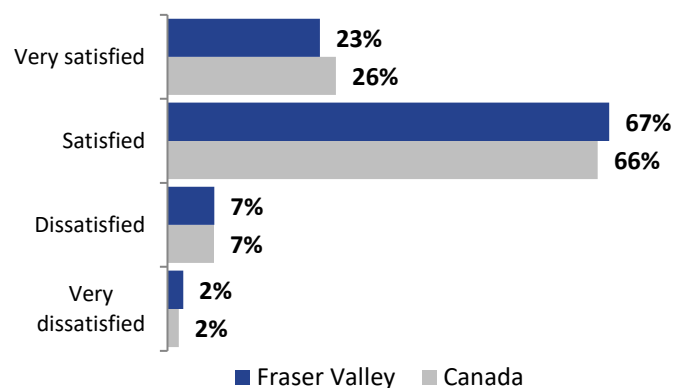
2. Satisfaction with overall quality of teaching



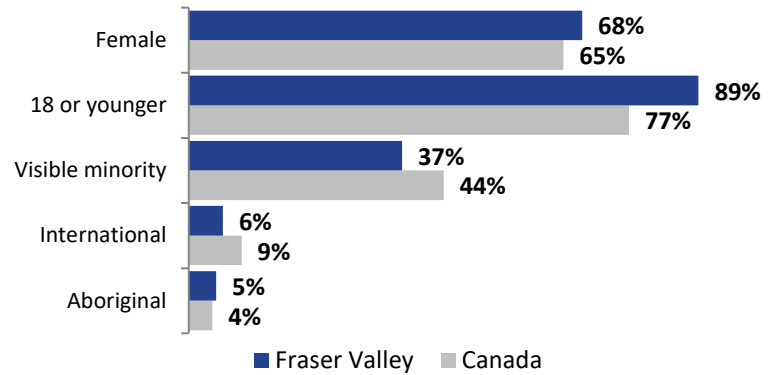
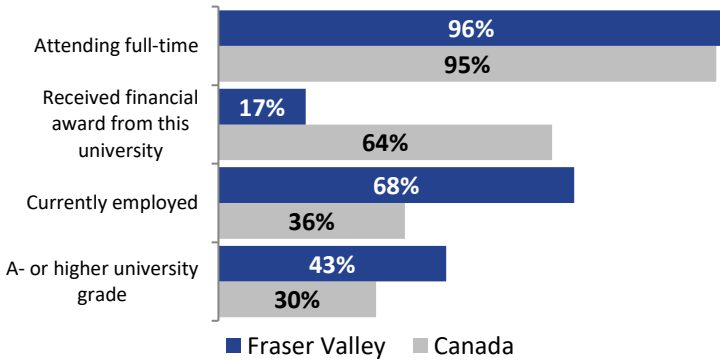
3. Success feeling like I belong at this university



4. Satisfaction with decision to attend this university

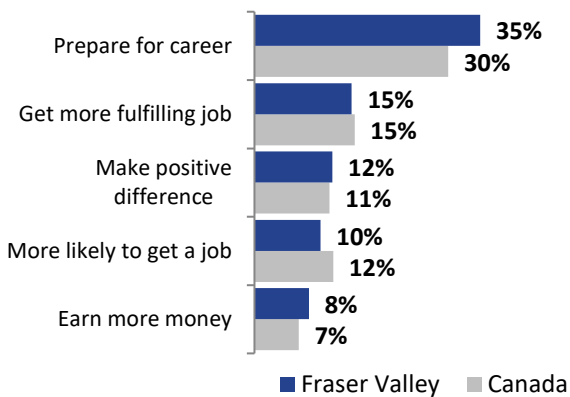


5. Profile of respondents



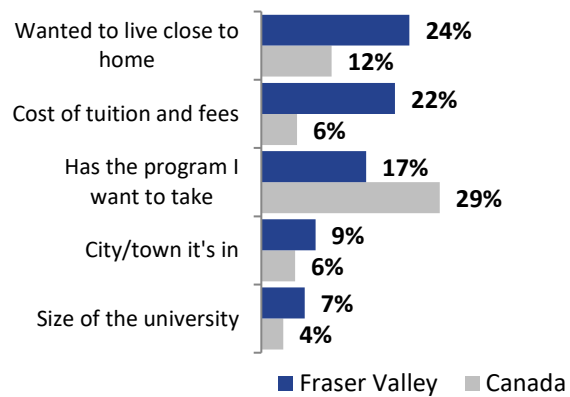
6. Top motivators for attending university

Most important reason (single response).



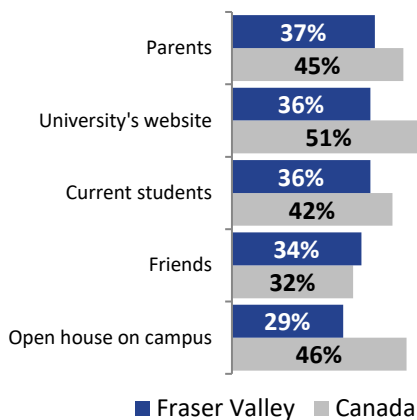
7. Top reasons for choosing this university

Most important reason (single response).

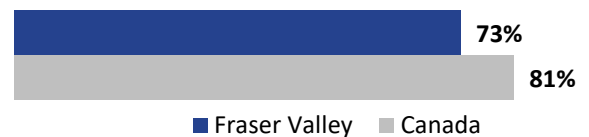


8. Most important sources of information about this university

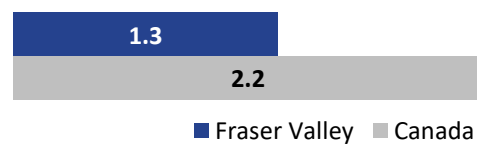

9. This university was their first choice

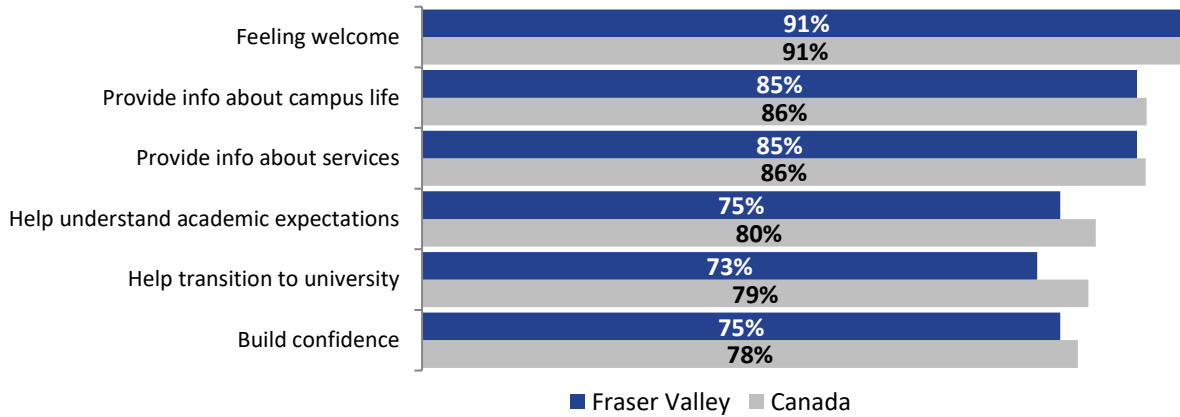
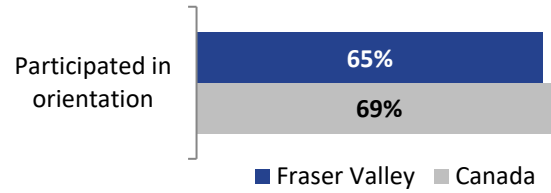

11. Orientation

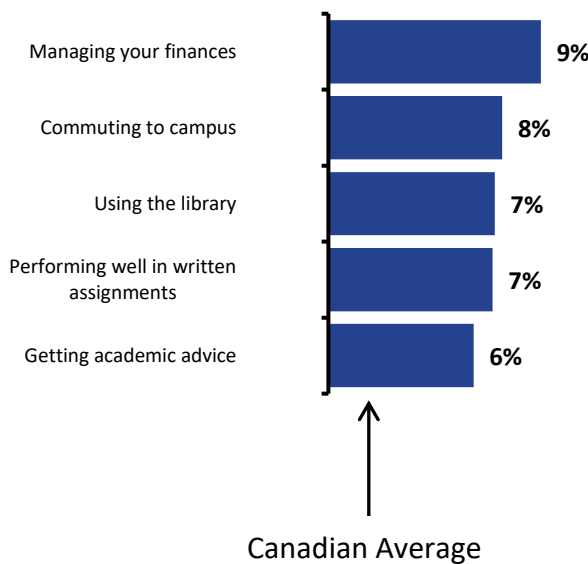
Those who were satisfied or very satisfied (on a four-point scale) with experiences related to orientation. Only those who participated in orientation responded to these questions.



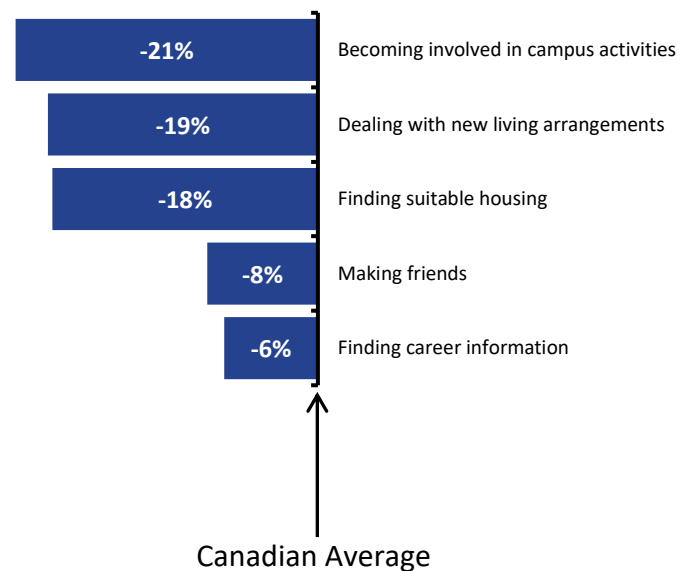
12. Success with transition to university

Top five areas compared to Canadian average

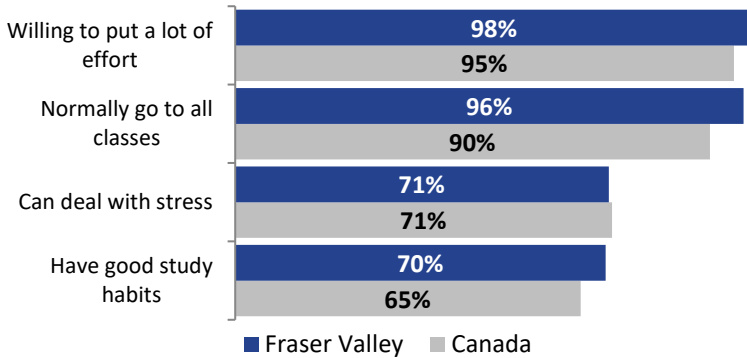


Bottom five areas compared to Canadian average



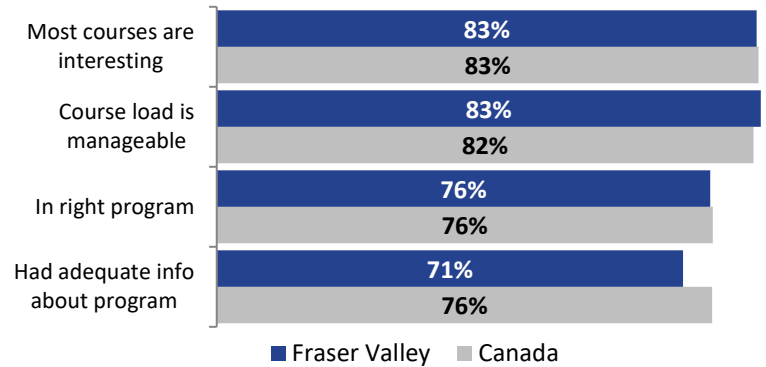
13. Perceptions of effort

Those who rated agree or strongly agree (on a four-point scale).

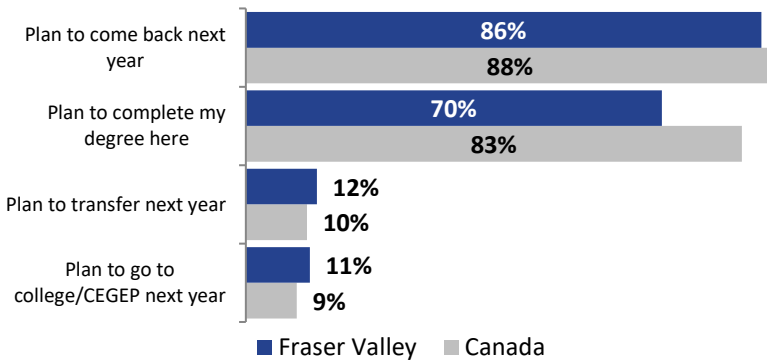


14. Perceptions of university education

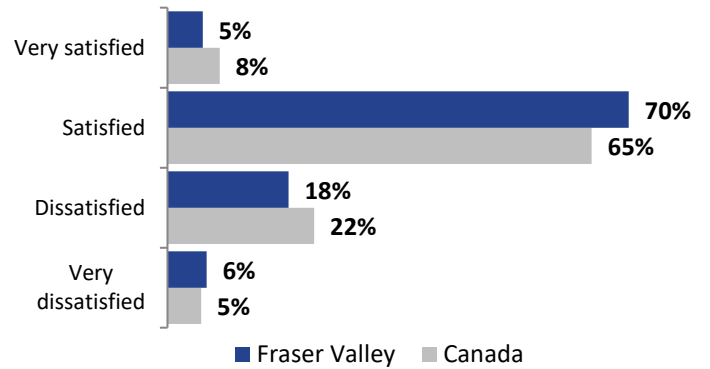

15. Commitment to this university

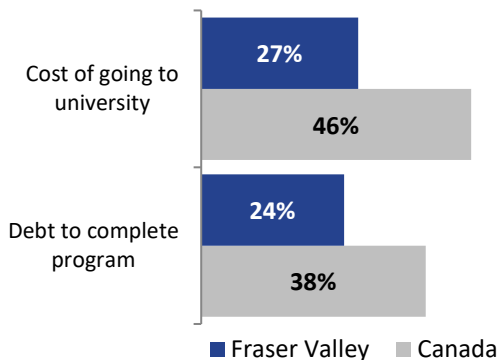


16. Concern shown to me as an individual
