## COVID-19 Safety Orientation for Events

At UFV, the health and safety of our community is paramount. As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to develop, UFV is striving to find ways to control or eliminate exposure to the virus across our campuses. We are doing this by putting into place proper risk controls, establishing safe work and learning practices, and providing education and training for all members of the UFV community.

Our protocols and procedures will protect faculty and staff, students, visitors, other workers, and/or the public who enter our facilities. This orientation is for event attendees.

Please help us prevent transmission of COVID-19 by using these protocols:

### 1. Daily Self-Assessment

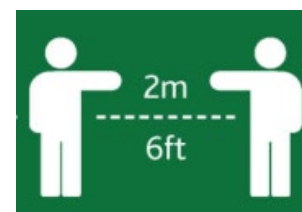
Each day before coming to campus-spaces, perform a [self-assessment](#) according to the criteria below. If you are displaying symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or identify one of the other risk factors, do not enter the campus space. Remain at home or return home, and refer to HealthLink BC at 8-1-1.

#### Do not enter the campus space if you:

- Have travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days
- Have been identified by Public Health as a close contact of someone with COVID-19
- Have been told to self-isolate by Public Health
- Are displaying any of the following new or worsening symptoms:
  - Fever or chills
  - Cough
  - Loss of sense of smell or taste
  - Difficulty breathing
  - Sore throat
  - Loss of appetite
  - Extreme fatigue or tiredness
  - Headache
  - Body aches
  - Nausea or vomiting
  - Diarrhea

### 2. Physical Distancing

Maintain physical distancing of 2 meters (6 feet) from other individuals on campus. Physical distancing is an effective method of preventing COVID-19 transmission. Indoor spaces are marked with maximum occupancies to support physical distancing.



### 3. Hand Hygiene

Use the hand sanitizer stations provided on entry and exit of any space. Wash your hands often.

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## 4. Non-Medical Masks/Face Coverings

Consistent with the guidance coming from the Provincial Health Office, at [UFV nonmedical masks/face coverings](#) are required to be worn in all indoor UFV spaces except if alone in your private office or workspace. The mask requirement does not apply to those who are unable to wear a mask or put on/remove a mask on their own.

## 5. Cleaning and Sanitation

The room has been cleaned according to our Institutional Safety Plan. Wipes are available for your use to support sanitation during the event.

## 6. Food and beverages

If food or beverages are provided as part of this event:

- Food will arrive prepackaged by a restaurant and beverages will be single serve.
- Food will be served to you by someone using gloves and a mask who will also collect and dispose of your containers.

## 7. Event Safety Plans

The event you are attending will have an Event Specific Safety Plan that is created by the hosts of the events and communicated to the attendees. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the host directly.
