Before Coming to Campus

- All members of the UFV community are encouraged to register for a vaccination. You can learn more information at <https://immunizebc.ca/>. There are some areas or activities at UFV that may require proof of vaccination. Further information on these areas is upcoming. UFV is [hosting on campus vaccination clinics](#) on specific days in September and October.
- If you are sick:
 1. Do not come to campus, remain at home. If you live in residence, remain in your unit. If you believe your illness may be COVID-19 related, contact public health at 8-1-1.
 2. Contact your instructor immediately and submit a [Student Declaration of Absence from Face-to-Face Classes, Activities, and Labs](#) form.

Arriving to and Being on Campus

- All individuals entering campus spaces must perform a [Daily Self-Assessment](#). Individuals who have identified symptoms or potential exposures during this self-check must not enter the campus.
- Individuals are required to [wear a non-medical masks/face covering in all indoor common areas](#), with some exemptions, including when eating or drinking, alone in a room, or lecturing *provided* that there is 2 meters or a barrier between them and other individuals. If you require an exemption to the mask mandate, contact the [Centre for Accessibility Services](#).
- Report any concerns you have while on campus to your instructor, or to Risk & Safety via the [hazard reporting portal](#).
- Be kind and remember that individuals may have exemptions to rules (such as the mask mandate) that you are unaware of. Report these concerns to your instructor or Risk & Safety.

Information on Other Protective Measures

- Barriers or partitions may continue to be used in busy client-facing settings including retail checkouts, kiosks, and food service counters.
- Ventilation systems in buildings are routinely maintained according to ASHRAE standards, including updating air re-circulating systems to MERV-13 filters and meeting the requirements for fresh-air composition in all spaces.
- Hand hygiene stations are available throughout campus spaces, including sanitation stations at entrances.
- [Routine cleaning](#) is scheduled for education spaces, public spaces, and other identified shared areas according to the Facilities cleaning schedule.
