
HEALTH & SAFETY TIPS FOR REMOTE WORK

Health & Safety

- Work area is reasonably quiet and free of distractions
- Cables and cords are secured under a desk or table or against a wall, and away from heat sources
- Temperature, ventilation, and lighting are adequate
- First aid supplies are readily available

Fire Safety

- Walkways, hallways, doorways, and floors are unobstructed and free of hazards
- Working smoke detectors cover the designated work area
- Charged, accessible fire extinguisher is available
- More than one exit from the work area
- Workspace is kept free of trash, clutter, and flammable liquids
- Radiators and portable heaters are located away from flammable items



Electrical Safety

- Computer equipment is connected to a surge protector
- Electrical system is adequate for computer equipment (breakers don't trip)
- All electrical, cords, outlets, and panels are in good condition. No exposed or damaged wiring
- Extension cords and power strips are not daisy-chained
- Electrical cords run in non-traffic areas, not under rugs, and nailed or stapled in place
- Equipment is turned off or put to sleep when not in use
- Electrical outlets are grounded with three -pronged plugs if necessary
