PHILOSOPHY

In accordance with the University Act of British Columbia [Section 59(1)], there must be a President of the University. This policy addresses the appointment of an acting President when the President is unavailable to fulfil their duties, or there is a vacancy in the office.

POLICY

- 1. When the President is absent or unable to fulfil their responsibilities for a period of less than six weeks, the Provost serves as acting President.
- 2. If the Provost is not available, the President or Provost choose another senior administrator of the University to serve as acting President and inform the Chair of the Board of Governors.
- 3. If the President is absent or unable to fulfill their responsibilities for a period exceeding six weeks, the Board of Governors appoints an acting President. The Executive Committee is responsible to manage the need for an acting President in a period between this six-week time frame and the next scheduled Board meeting.
- 4. In cases where a President's term ends and a successor is not yet in place, resigns, or is permanently unable to complete their term, the Board of Governors appoints an interim President to serve until a full search is completed.
- 5. An acting or interim President consults with the President or Board Chair as applicable for any direction on carrying out their duties during the appointment.
