2. FPS News

2.1. Adult Education – Seonaigh MacPherson

- The department received two Fund for Innovative Teaching (FIT) awards one for Seonaigh MacPherson's project for faculty and student development in mindfulness and one for Linda Pardy's study of teaching innovation.
- Dr. Linda Pardy received a ROSA award for 2017-2018. Seonaigh MacPherson was approached by the Centre for the Canadian Language Benchmarks and the head of settlement language services for IRCC (formerly CIC) of the Government of Canada to prepare a policy report by March 31, 2017 on the advisability of adopting the CLB/NCLC as the language standard across language education contexts in Canada (vs. CEFR).
- Dr. Mary Saudelli of Teaching and Learning and Eileen Burkholder of Student Services are each teaching courses in our Spring session, demonstrating our policy and practice of working more collaboratively with other units academic and otherwise at UFV.

2.5. School of Business – Frank Ulbrich

- The School of Business held its third Finance Career Networking breakfast on February 3, 2017. Six organizations and approximately 40 BBA students participated in the event, learning about career opportunities in the financial industry in the Fraser Valley.
- On February 24, 2017, School of Business faculty joined the President and Dean Dr. Tracy Ryder Glass in participating at the Mission Chamber of Commerce Business Excellence Awards.
- The School of Business hosted the Business After Business Mixer for Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce members and guests from the community on March 9, 2017. Students and faculty engaged with the community over appetizers and drinks to discuss new programs, sustainability business practices, and whether their businesses are ready for millennials.

• The School of Business completed, and will submit this month, its first sharing information on progress report for the United Nations regarding UFV's commitment to responsible management education.

2.6. School of Social Work and Human Services – Margaret Coombes

- March 13 17, 2017 is Social Work Week. The School Of Social Work and Human Services ordered three types of pins that acknowledge Social Work Week that are being distributed to students and staff. Printed posters are also being displayed throughout the campus.
- The School will have a display table on March 15, 2017 near the Library rotunda with SWHS students distributing pamphlets and information about Social Work.
- Dr. Harding's class, Social Work and Community Development, will host two events on March 16, 2017. Student will present on how to advocate on behalf of those affected by the opioid crisis and the use of Narcan. This event will be held in the SUB Great Hall at 2:30 pm. In addition, students organized a Round Table Discussion that will be hosted by the Mennonite Brethren Church in Abbotsford on at 6 pm. The Round Table will address the funding cuts to HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis C service providers in the Fraser Valley. These SOWK 392 projects may be on display outside the social work offices on March 17, 2017.
- The Fraser River Branch of the BC Association of Social Workers (BCASW), UFV School of Social Work and Human Services, and the Student Social Work Association (SSWA) are presenting the Roopchand Seebaran Legacy Social Work Advocacy Awards. This award is to promote Social Work Week and Social Work Advocacy in the Fraser River Region. This year the award recipients are Gary Thandi, MSW, RSW and Amar (Alex) Sangha, MSW, RCSW, who will also present on "The Power of Social Work Advocacy". The ceremony is scheduled for 7 pm on March 16, 2017 at the UFV Abbotsford Campus in room A360.

2.7. Teacher Education – Vandy Britton

- All current students (Cohort 10) are in their certifying practicum.
- The Master of Education in Educational Leadership and Mentorship is on the agenda for the next Graduate Studies Committee.
- Interviews and selections are complete for the Fall intake (Cohort 11). There will be two full cohorts this year. As well, for the first time, the secondary cohort will be equal in number between the Humanities and the Math/Science streams (16 in each stream). This makes our room situation very challenging. We currently have two appropriately sized classrooms and one very small one that fits 12 people in a boardroom style set-up. This is not reasonable, given that this is the classroom where they will be conducting science experiments and where we are trying to promote learner-centred teaching pedagogy. This classroom is also an e-lite room, making organization more challenging for the instructor.
- The SAC has shortlisted its candidates and interviews will occur at the end of April for a new faculty hire.
- The 10th Anniversary Alumni Gala will occur on April 7, 2017. Invitations have been sent to all alumni and the list is being finalized for community and UFV supporter invitations.
