2.4. Library and Information Technology - Kenneth Gariepy

- On March 29, 2017 the LIBIT program students participated in an interdisciplinary community outreach event at the Chilliwack Five Corners Campus with students from Health Science, Continuing Studies, and the School of Social Work and Human Services. LIBIT students provided information services and handed out free books to at-risk youth as part of this Health and Wellness Event for Youth.
- LIBIT just completed a second, but failed, search for a permanent faculty member.

2.5. School of Business - Frank Ulbrich

- On April 7, 2017, the School of Business organized a Principles for Responsible
 Management Education (PRME) faculty workshop to discuss opportunities to integrate
 the PRME Initiative into curricular and extracurricular activities. An example from some
 North-American universities was reviewed and its applicability at UFV was discussed.
- The School of Business was an exhibitor at the Fraser Valley Chambers of Commerce Business Showcase on April 19, 2017. They met with members of the local business community and discussed issues surrounding sustainable business development.
- As part of their experiential learning with a real client, Mark Breedveld's BUS 322
 (Advanced Selling) class sold \$4,935 in memberships for the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce. This was an increase of 34% over last year.

2.6. School of Social Work and Human Services – Margaret Coombes

- The School of Social Work and Human Services and the SWHS Advisory Council hosted a Community Forum on April 20, 2017 at UFV in the Great Hall. There were over 60 representatives from community agencies, schools, and various organizations, as well as UFV alumni. During the morning, attendees participated in a facilitated discussion about each of the programs and the participants had an opportunity to share community employment needs, challenges in the workforce, and provide input on future SWHS programs. Guest speakers included Mark Evered, Tracy Ryder Glass, Rene Inkster, and Eddie Gardner (Elder in Residence). The keynote speaker was Gordon Phaneuf, MSW, RSW, and CEO of Child Welfare League of Canada. The information compiled will be reviewed at the SWHS Advisory Council meeting on June 13, 2017.
- The School of Social Work and Human Services is presently undergoing a search for an Assistant Professor and an LTA position.

2.7. Teacher Education - Vandy Britton

- Due to the teacher shortage, a large number of our current students have already
 received job offers. It is extremely early in the process for this to occur since these
 students have almost a month more of practicum and more coursework to complete
 after this. Given the current job climate, we anticipate that virtually all students will
 have positions in the district of their choice by the end of the program.

- The Master of Education in Educational Leadership and Mentorship is being presented at Senate today.
- Student Nikita Griffioen, has been selected as Convocation Speaker. She will represent the Faculty of Professional Studies very well.
