3. FPS News

3.1. School of Business – Frank Ulbrich

- From October 1 6, 2017, the School of Business offered its sixth annual seminar on leadership in the context of globalization for Master of Business Administration (MBA) students from the University of Applied Sciences and Arts, Lucerne, Switzerland. In total, 28 students participated, including three Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) students from UFV.
- On October 6, 2017, the School of Business had its third <u>Sales Careers</u> <u>Networking Breakfast</u>. More than 100 students were in attendance and met with twelve different employers. It was a pleasure to see that some BBA alumni returned to UFV as recruiters.
- The School of Business has conducted a focus group meeting with current BBA students to elicit feedback on the perception, design, delivery, and quality of the BBA program. The results will be used in the continual improvement of the program and for the accreditation report the School is currently working on.
- In September 2017, Dr. Jelena Brcic presented two papers at the 68th International Astronautical Congress, Adelaide, Australia. Dr. Bricic also had a paper published in the *Journal of Human Performance in Extreme Environments*. Dr. Don Miskiman published his manuscript on *"Fusing People with Places. A Mashup of How People Construct Built Environments & How These Environments Influence People."*

 Ilm Kassam, a Bachelor of Social Work graduate and current Master of Social Work student, won the 2017 Inspiring Social Worker of the Year Award.
