3. FPS News

3.1. School of Business – Frank Ulbrich

- Bachelor of Business Administration student Keenan Beavis has been selected to participate in the 2017-2018 Ch'nook Scholars cohort. The Ch'nook Scholars program gives Aboriginal post-secondary business students the tools and connections they need to succeed in their studies and careers, as well as a range of other benefits.
- The School of Business has two faculty openings in accounting. These are posted and it is hoped to fill them for an August 2018 start.
- The School of Business held its first alumni event on October 25, 2017. About 30 participants gathered at the Reach Gallery in Abbotsford. It is planned to make this an annual event and to attract more alumni in the future.

3.2. Department of Child, Youth and Family Studies – *Maple Melder-Crozier*

- The Department of Child, Youth and Family Studies has been approved and accepted to begin the Child and Youth Care Accreditation process with the National Accrediting body. This will work with the data collection for the Program Review.
- The Graduate Certificate in Child Life and Community Health was approved at GSC and SBC. The next step is APPC approval.
- The Department of Child, Youth and Family Studies are in discussions regarding a CityStudio project identified by the City of Abbotsford attached to a CYC course.
