4. FPS News

4.1. School of Business – *Tracy Ryder Glass on behalf of Frank Ulbrich*

- Faculty and students from the aviation programs attended an event organized by Swoop Airlines at the Abbotsford airport. Students were given the opportunity to talk for 30 minutes with WestJet's CEO Gregg Saretsky.
- The SAC for the vacant Accounting positions has completed their search and made hiring recommendations to the Dean.
- The School of Business is opening its doors to the local business community, student entrepreneurs from the BBA program, and School of Business alumni on March 8, 2018. This will be a unique opportunity to bring generations together to network and talk about business development opportunities for and in the Fraser Valley region.
- On March 9, 2018, the School of Business will host a Sustainability Case Competition. The competition is open to all UFV students and interdisciplinary teams are encouraged to participate.

4.2. Department of Library and Information Technology – *Kenneth Gariepy*

- The first Read-In community event was hosted on December 6, 2017. The 26 books which were read or discussed ranged across all age groups and genres. The success has led to a second Read-In and "Blind Date with a Book" event scheduled for February 28, 2018.
- This year, 20 students are registered in LIBT 265/266
 Practicum/Capstone Project. 3 will complete the project and 17 will
 participate in a 70-hour field placement. Students have been placed in
 UFV Libraries, MEI Schools, Surrey Libraries, Fraser Valley Regional
 Library System, Kwantlen Polytechnic University Library, the Campus
 Card Office, Summit Pacific College Library, and CIVL 101.7 FM.
 Placements at the University of Victoria Libraries and Kamloops Public
 Library are under negotiation.
- The reconstituted External Program Advisory Committee held their first meeting on February 5, 2018. Kenneth Gariepy was elected Chair and the group discussed their approved Terms of Reference as well as the process for course and program revisions.

4.3. School of Social Work and Human Services – *Margaret Coombes*

• Curtis Magnuson attended an Honouring Ceremony for Social Services Diploma student Sydney Ned on February 9, 2018. Sydney is being recognized by W.A. Fraser Middle School for her cultural work while a practicum student and is now employed as an Indigenous Cultural Support Worker.

- The Commission on Accreditation approved the request to extend the term of accreditation of the Bachelor of Social Work program by one year to synchronize the processes with the Master of Social Work program.
- SOWK 380 Community Development students have scheduled <u>a</u> <u>screening of the documentary The Other Side of the Hero</u> followed by a panel discussion and aftercare for those who need it on March 8, 2018. The event aims to give those who struggle with PTSD a platform, highlight the importance of emotional wellness, raise awareness, and connect those with PTSD to community support systems.
- Darrell Fox and approximately 30 Social Work and Nursing students are collaborating on a poverty simulation experience at the Black Box Theatre on March 9, 2018.

4.4. Department of Teacher Education – Barbara Salingré

- Pending paperwork, the Department of Teacher Education is pleased to have successfully filled the vacant elementary focused Assistant Professor position.
- Admissions for 2018-2019 closed on January 31, 2018 with nearly double the number of applications compared to last year. Apparently application numbers in Teacher Education programs are up across the province.
- The Department of Teacher Education is piloting a new interview process this year modeled after the MMI (multiple mini-interview) process used by many medical programs. We are excited to be the first Teacher Education program across Canada to implement this interview process and will be researching our graduation success rates in comparison to the panel interview process used for the past 8 years.
