3. FPS News

3.1. Department of Child, Youth and Family Studies – *Christine Slavik*

- RoseAnne Timbrell has been hired as a new faculty member. Rose developed and has been teaching the Indigenous Perspectives in Child and Youth Care Practice course since 2011. Mark Littlefield has been hired as a Limited Term Appointment for 2018-2019.
- The 20th Canadian, 12th Triennial International Child and Youth Care Conferences, Transition & Transformations: Influencing Change through Relational Practice, was held in Richmond from May 2 to 4, 2018. UFV students, faculty, and community partners presented at the pre-conference Education Day as well as the main conference. Cindy Rammage, Maple Melder-Crozier, and Christine Slavik delivered workshops. CYC students Pamela Nicholls and Shanna Yaroshuk, along with Rob Lees from Chilliwack Community Mental Health and Collette Bohach from Big Brothers and Big Sisters Chilliwack, presented.
- Faculty members attended two articulation meetings in May 2018: ECE Articulation in Nanaimo and Human Services Articulation in Terrace.
- The program review site visit was held on May 15 and 16, 2018. A department retreat will be held in August 2018 to address items from the program review and set strategic goals for the next 3-5 years.
- A provincial grant to expand Early Childhood Education offerings was accepted by the government. Delivery of the Infant/Toddler Diploma will be expanded beginning Fall 2018 and applications have already been received for these additional seats. The Department is working on a proposal to seek funding for the second and third years of this grant opportunity.
- Applications for the Graduate Certificate in Child Life and Community Health opened on May 1, 2018. Currently, one Child Life Intern is completing a 5 month placement at the Nottingham Children's Hospital, Renal Unit at the Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham, Great Britain. Another intern will begin her placement at BC Children's Hospital in August 2018.
- The feedback and evaluation of the Animal Assisted Therapy and Equine Facilitated Wellness was overwhelmingly positive. After this successful pilot, the Department is moving forward with developing a 3 credit course.

3.2. School of Business – Frank Ulbrich

- The School of Business held its spring retreat on May 29, 2018 reviewing progress on achieving its strategic goals, focusing on excellent teaching practices, and managing assessment quality assurance.
- School of Business students were in attendance at the Undergraduate Research Excellence Award Dinner and were recognized for their research contributions.
- After having competed in the regional competitions, the UFV Enactus team went to Toronto to participate in the national Enactus competition.
