- 1. I want to mention that I have a collection of books that I maintain in my office that some may want to see/borrow. I am a bit of a book hound but a few people who have met in my office have commented and borrowed some of them and I am happy to make them available. (I keep track of who has what)
- 2. Peer Mentoring Initiative for BUS 100 up and running. Thank you to Kim Milnes for all her efforts in this. At the end of the term, I will be asking BUS 100 faculty, peer mentors and students (anonymously) to provide feedback on the program.
- 3. I am working with ISCC to develop Indigenizing Curriculum Guidelines carry over from previous role at UFV wherein I facilitated a series of workshops aimed to elicit their thoughts/ideas of what this means for UFV. Once the guidelines are fully developed based on the committees' contributions, this will be forwarded to the ISCC for their further contributions. Eventually will be distributed for Campus Wide Consultation
- 4. BAM is in development. It will be an online Business degree program (with some hybrid sessions with a PLAR component). The students for this program are working professionals who need a business degree to move forward in their careers. So flexibility is integral to the program. We are hoping to have up and running September/January. The working group is in development of the BAM courses now (and seeking volunteers who may be interested). We have also had a presentation from Adult Education, Seonaigh MacPherson and Chris Campbell on PLAR and block credit that was extremely helpful.
- 5. John Potts and I have met regarding the Hochschule Luzern-Wirtschaft University Master students trip to BC. I have also spoken with our contact person Jillaine Farrar and the planning and initial organization is beginning. I will be emailing the former working group to see who wishes to be a part of this year's event.
- I have the Annual PD plans from most people and have looked them over. I wonder if Faculty Council would like me to put together a brief presentation to summarize the aspects of PD that people represented (no names of course). I welcome your thoughts.
- 7. Garry Fehr, Maureen Wideman and I will be preparing a workshop/presentation on the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning as a research vehicle. (FIT funding, research ethics clearance, typical methodologies, research questions, etc).
- 8. I have a new with Dr. Justin Williams, Director of International at Niagara College. We are guest editing a Special Issue for the Journal of Educational Leadership regarding: International Leadership across Disciplines. Dr. Williams and I have a chapter entitled "The Curious Case of Leadership in International Higher Education." This is an opportunity for those interested to submit an

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article/be a peer reviewer. Also, we shall be looking for someone who may wish to publish a book review. Please speak to me about this.
