4. FPS News

4.1. Department and School News

School of Business – Carl Janzen

- New faculty members Liz Wiebe and Saeed Rahman were welcomed.
- The Lucerne Seminar will be held the week of September 29, 2019.
- The International Business Alumni Mixer will be held on September 30, 2019.
- A panel is being held on October 1, 2019 called Bring the World to Canada and Canada to the World with Dr. Garry Fehr; Dr. Jon Thomas; Councillor Sandy Blue; and Timothy Kendrick, President and Chief Designer, BW Global. Mayor Henry Braun is attending as a special guest.
- The annual Welcome Back BBQ was very successful with well over 200 attendees, including faculty, staff, students, and members of the Professional Studies Dean's Office. UFV Sustainability and Enactus had booths at the event as well.
- A seminar called Strategic Shifts Toward Regenerative Sustainability: The Pivotal Role of Ecological Knowledge with Saeed Rahman will occur on September 13, 2019 in C1429.

Department of Child, Youth and Family Studies - Christine Slavik

- The department retreat was held in late August 2019. The department continues to develop plans based on the Program Review
 Recommendations and are now working on years 2 and 3 post review.
 In the spirit of continuing to develop a fulsome plan towards
 Indigenization, Lorna Andrews from Teaching & Learning will deliver two workshops during the Fall Department meetings: Ask Anything and Cultural Safety.
- Ways to deepen our understanding of and connection to our "Community of Practice" is being explored. Conversations with alumni and those working in the field with monthly Saturday get togethers are beginning. Faculty in Child and Youth Care (CYC) are working together to put a proposal together to present at the National CYC conference in Newfoundland & Labrador: Team Culture: What we do and how we do it. The workshop will explore the process of becoming a strong working team in CYC education, practice and community, and how team culture translates into how we flourish, teach and impact students and ultimately those our students work with.
- The department is continuing dinner and dialogue meetings with sessional faculty to continue to build connections. This semester's meeting will take place at "Beestro" at the Honeybee Centre.

- Monique Goerzen and Maple Melder Crozier had a successful trip to Scotland to explore partnerships and plan an International experience study tour for UFV students from ECE and CYC in Outdoor Curriculum and Activity Planning for Children and Youth.
- 2 Child Life interns are beginning their 600 hours in a clinical placement with hospitals in BC and Alberta this Fall. 3 more are aiming to begin their placements in January 2020.
- Christine Slavik will be delivering a webinar via UMind on September 19, 2019 titled What is a Labyrinth & How Can it be Used as a Tool in Youth Mental Health? Walking the Labyrinth as a Tool to Reduce Stress, Promote Calm and Integrate Challenging Experiences. A reminder that UMind is a free organization that students may want to consider joining if they are interested in supporting youth and families facing mental health challenges, or if this is an area of study and professional development they are pursuing.
- Two interdisciplinary developments are underway:
 - Christine Slavik is a mentor for some of the MBTL 700 students in the Graduate Cert in Mindfulness Based Teaching and Learning.
 - One of the department's community partners with the Human Services Career Enrichment Program (HSCeP) is proposing an interdisciplinary credit course with UFV that would see UFV students in Criminology, Social Work and Child and Youth Care take the course as they serve as mentors for Chilliwack high school students and participate in the Saturday trainings in Mindfulness, Child and Family UN Rights, Peace building & Conflict Resolution, etc.

Department of Library and Information Technology – *Tracy Ryder Glass, on behalf of Christina Neigel*

- Christina Neigel has taken the role of Department Head for LIBIT. She also graduated in June with her Doctorate in Education in Leadership in Post-Secondary Contexts.
- The department's latest faculty addition, Fiona Hunt, left in August to pursue another opportunity. The department is beginning a new search to replace her.
- Enrollments are high and we continue to grapple with the unique needs of our international and distance students.

School of Social Work and Human Services – *Margaret Coombes*

- The School of Social Work and Human Services has had many changes and are pleased to welcome new team members:

- Dr. Awneet Sivia was welcomed back from sabbatical.
- The 13th cohort of Bachelor of Education teacher candidates were welcomed on August 19, 2019. This is the second year with a larger cohort of 96 students. The semester began with a 3-day comprehensive orientation and then moved directly into coursework.
- The Teacher Education Department continues with their theme of "What does it mean to be a socially just educator in the Fraser Valley?" and has arranged a series of programmatic experiences that happen outside of the courses to augment their learning. This will include a site visit to St. Mary's Indian Residential School on September 24, 2019.
- The instructor for the summer course in the Master of Education in Educational Leadership was excellent and the students were all very keen. Of the 24 candidates in the program, 12 are TED alumni.
