5. Schools and Associate Dean News

5.1. School of Business – Khyati Shetty

- Faculty members published articles, participated in research workshops, and attended events hosted by international organizations.
- An opportunity for faculty to participate in a seven-week training program delivered by US experts on how to implement Collaborative Online International Learning is in progress.
- The school had meetings with a national research organization focused on research funding and internships.
- Two members from the school will be participating in a cultural learning exchange program.

5.2. School of Computing – Carl Janzen

- Frank Zhang received approval for a study tour in China this April.
- The school is in the final stages of the BCIS program review response document.
- The school hosted a Hackathon and Global Jam.
- The school worked on a publication involving students.
- Faculty members had recent publications and participated in community engagement activities.

5.3. Associate Dean – Kevin Wainwright

- Kevin will be a keynote speaker at for the Chilliwack Chamber of Commerce's event in February. He will be speaking on the post-COVID-19 economy. Kevin and Khyati are also working on a project with the Chamber.
- Kevin's BUS 499 students have been working on an environmental scan of the Fraser Valley to give an overview of the different organizations and their educational needs.
- An associate certificate focused on social enterprise is in progress.
- Unique training options for Trades have been discussed.
- Opportunities to have a drone demonstration at Seabird Island and high school classrooms are being discussed.
- Kevin continues to work on ensuring that current and future students in the School of Business Post-Baccalaureate diploma programs have the right support resources to be better prepared for their programs.
