3.1. School of Business – *Khyati Shetty*

 on the changing external environment and how it impacts the school's
 programs. There was also an alumni panel and celebration for Lorne
 Mackenzie's retirement.
- Cindy Stewart attended a City Focus Group which discussed the retail industry. Cindy's participation will give the school valuable insights for the retail industry.
- Jason Campbell has been appointed to the Commissioner's National Indigenous Advisory Committee.
- Khyati Shetty represented the school at the Agri-tech Panel during the Grounded Innovation event hosted by FAI. The event showed how innovation was shaping agriculture and food systems.
- A few members from the school had the opportunity to attend the Leaders Luncheon with the Minster of Jobs and Economic Development, Diana Gibson. The lunch included great conversations and an energizing exchange of ideas.
