4.1. School of Business – Khyati Shetty

- The school hosted their retreat in August. The retreat included presentations and discussions about enrolment numbers and projections from Vladimir Dvoracek (Institutional Research Planning) and Kevin Jeske (Human Resources). It also included introductions from the Faculty and Staff Association President, an Insights Discovery Shop on communication and collaboration, and a session on Artificial Intelligence in Teaching.
- Kevin deWolde, Felicia Chong, and Mark Breedveld were recognized for their service excellence.
- The advisors, staff, and faculty who participated in the Student Orientation were thanked.
- Faculty members were thanked for being flexible during enrolment changes.

4.2. School of Computing - Opeyemi Adesina

- The Computing Students Association (CSA) has a new executive team for the 2025-2026 academic year. The President of the CSA will be attending the Business and Computing Faculty Council to represent computing students.
- Five computing students received grants. The faculty members that mentored them were thanked.
- Two computing students have been accepted to fully funded Master's programs.
- The Stage 1 proposal for the Master of Science in Computer Science received the minister's approval. The Stage 2 proposal is in progress.
- The new advanced computing lab has been completed. The school is looking forward to the new opportunities that the lab will bring.

- Frank Zhang became a member of the Editorial Board for the Journal of Advances in Engineering and Technology.
- Ibrahim Javed presented on Overview Polygon at the Blockchain Summit Institute at the University of British Columbia.
- Carl Janzen had a recent trip to China.

4.3. Associate Dean – Kevin Wainwright

 Kevin is focused on developing relationships with the greater Fraser Valley to reach domestic markets such as high schools, the business community, and mature students. Opportunities such as training,

- research projects, and internships could be developed for these audiences.
- Students worked on an independent studies projects that included an environmental scan of the needs of the Fraser Valley and a market research study on microcredentials.
- The microcredential pilots went well. More opportunities for microcredential partnerships with community groups and the Chamber of Commerce are being discussed.
- The development of microcredentials focused on Indigenous land management is in progress.
- Research and project-based microcredentials with students focusing on case studies for industries and companies are in development.

7.1. Dean's Report – Chris Schinckus

- The new members of the Business and Computing Faculty Council were welcomed.
- The process for updating the Faculty Standards will begin this academic year. Updates on this process will continue to be shared.
- A new Students Engagement Committee was created to work with the Presidents of the Business and Computing clubs and associations. The goal of the committee is to identify opportunities for collaborations and ways to optimize resources. The Dean, Associate Dean, School Directors, and Student Union Society President are a part of the committee. There will also be opportunities for students to share reports at the Business and Computing Faculty Council meetings.

- Updates about the advisory group and working group for the development of the Master of Agritech program will be shared soon.
- The School of Computing were congratulated for receiving approval for Stage 1 of the Master of Science in Computer Science program development process.
- Accreditation reviews are in progress. These accreditations could bring new opportunities for domestic and international students.
- An international internship is now in place with Qatar University in Kuala Lumpur. Students will gain work experience and credits for their program.
- Microcredential development processes are in progress, including the development of international and domestic partnerships.
- The upcoming guest speakers at Faculty Council meetings include representatives from UFV's Teaching & Learning Office and President James Mandigo.

- The first class of the Halq'eméylem Language Learning Sessions occurred on September 11. The classes will continue for the Fall semester.
