3. FPS News

3.1. Department and School News

Department of Adult Education – Chris Campbell

 Another successful Self-Studies in Higher Education session was held on Project Based Learning on September 18, 2019. The next session is on Community Engagement and will be held on October 16, 2019 in room B133 from 11 am - 1 pm.

School of Business - Carl Janzen

- Lucerne International Week occurred from September 29 October 4, 2019. General feedback was that this was the best year to date. The question "would you recommend to others" was rated 4.9/5.0. Specific feedback for individual sessions is still being reviewed. Next year will be the tenth anniversary year.
- The Girls Can Fly Too event occurred from October 5-6, 2019.
- Jelena Brcic is presenting three papers at a conference in Washington, DC October 21-25, 2019 at the International Astronautical Congress, which draws about 10,000 people from around the world.
- A one-year extension on the CSA grant was received with potential for further renewal.
- Jelena Brcic has been invited to give a talk at the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology in April 2020 in Austin.
- Carl Janzen is attending Chair Academy from October 21-25, 2019.
 Gerry Palmer will be acting director during this period.
- The School of Business is continuing their seminar series with a focus on Ethics, Responsibility, and Sustainability October 11, 2019 at 11:30 am in C1429 with light lunch provided. The theme for this session is "An Open Conversation on Data Sovereignty: Reconciling our responsibility to protect student privacy with the critical imperative of preparing our students for effective engagement in a globally interdependent digital economy."

Department of Library and Information Technology – *Tracy Ryder Glass on behalf of Christina Neigel*

 Students have been immersed in preparing selections and questions for the <u>Reading Link Challenge</u>. This province-wide program for grade 4 and 5 students engages them in a series of knowledge competitions about a specific selection of books. Challenges begin in January 2020 and would not be possible without the support of the Department of Library and Information Technology and student volunteers.

- A student social was held on October 1, 2019. Students from the LIBIT diploma program enjoyed an informal meet-and-greet pizza lunch, sponsored by the department. The event offers students, new to each other, an opportunity to socialize, participate in their student association, and think about involvement in professional organizations by becoming student representatives.
- The LIBIT program is full. Applications are rolling in on target and class enrolments are sitting at a 91% fill rate.

School of Social Work and Human Services – *Margaret Coombes*

- As a result of 4 new faculty and 2 new field coordinators, there is a contagious new energy in the School.
- Brianna Strumm published an article:

- Amanda LaVallee is active with her research and scholarly contributions to academia. Her SSHR grant title is We know who we are: Intergenerational Understanding of Metis Identity and Well-being using digital storytelling. Amanda and several of her colleagues are going to Berkeley University of California December 11-13, 2019 for digital storytelling training. Amanda also recently accepted the position of Peer Reviewer for CIHR for the Network Environments for Indigenous Health Research. The purpose of the Network Environments for Indigenous Health Research (NEIHR) Program is to establish a national network of centres focused on capacity development, research and knowledge translation centred on Indigenous Peoples (i.e., First Nations, Inuit and Métis).

 Through Deliberate Practice, will occur October 16, 2019. Scott D.

 presenting and fifty students and faculty are attending.

Teacher Education Department – *Tracy Ryder Glass*, on behalf of Vandy Britton

- Teacher Education is preparing the teacher candidates to go into the field on their 5 week school experience beginning on October 21, 2019.
 The 96 teacher candidates are placed in 5 different districts in 32 schools with 113 different teacher mentors (practicing teachers in the field).
- Continuing with our theme of "What does it mean to be a socially just educator?" the Secondary teacher candidates are going on a site visit to the Reach Gallery in Abbotsford this afternoon to learn about the draining of Sumas Lake and the subsequent impact on the Sto:lo people.
- The second course of the Masters in Education began last week. This course focuses on mentorship and is running on Friday evenings and full day Saturdays for 6 weeks.
- A posting for a faculty position in TED (teaching in both the MEd and the BEd) is now live with a review date of November 4, 2019. The department is looking for a candidate with a PhD in Educational Leadership, with practical experience as a K-12 school administrator.
