

This course is designed to provide prospective and practicing French teachers with an understanding of current theories, curriculum frameworks, and pedagogies related to teaching elementary and secondary Core French and French Immersion in British Columbia. Students will explore the concept of bilingual education within the multicultural Canadian context, deepen their understanding of second language acquisition (theory and practice), and expand their repertoire of curriculum designs and teaching approaches for FSL classrooms. This course will be of interest to UFV undergraduate and B.Ed. students contemplating a career as a French teacher and to current French Immersion and Core French teachers who wish to enhance their language proficiencies and classroom teaching practices. The course will be offered in person on the UFV campus with additional online learning opportunities.

Please note: this course will be offered in French. Students must have a have an independent level of proficiency (minimum B1 CEFR level).
