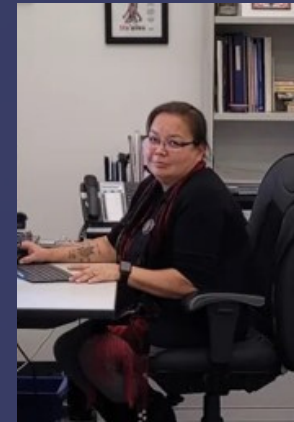
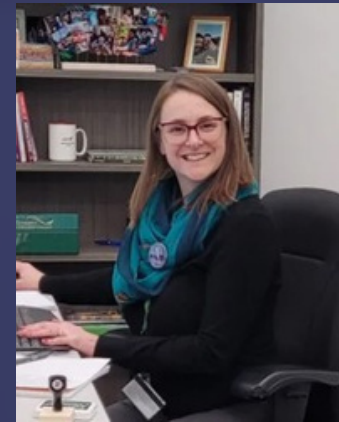

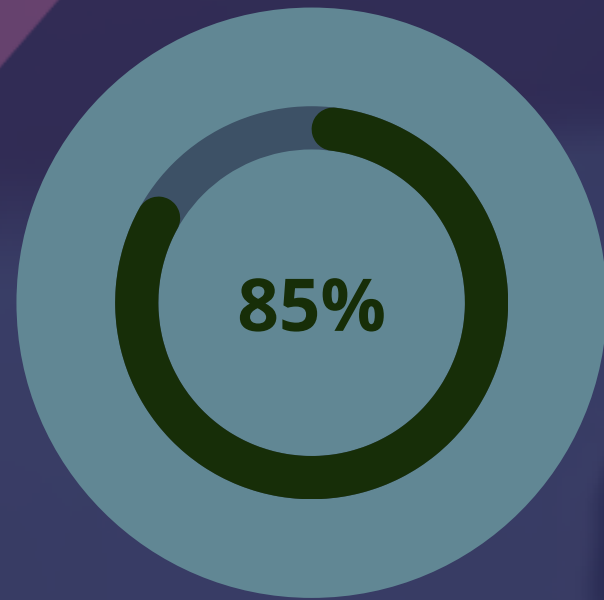
PDDAY2022

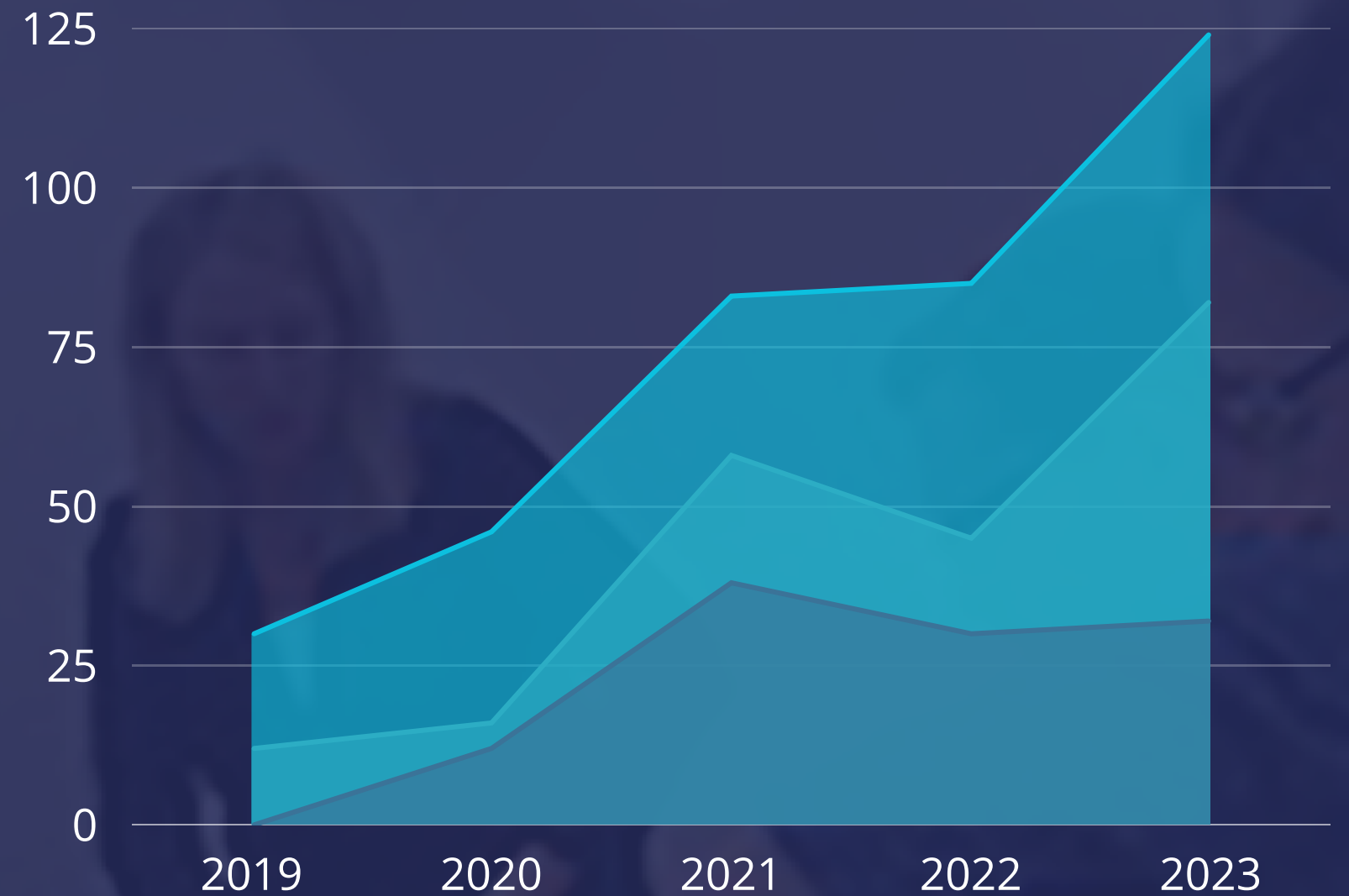

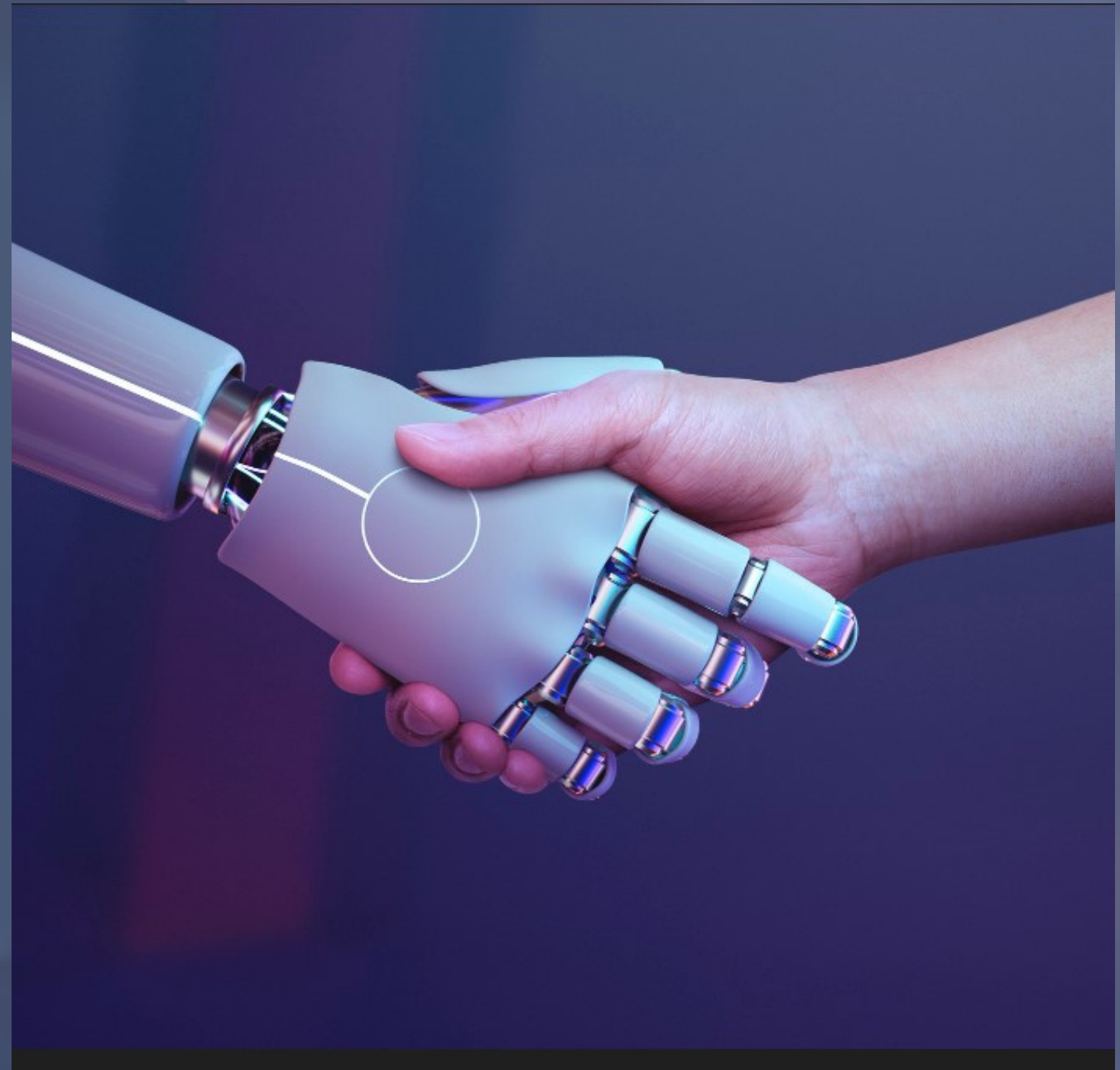

OPEN EDUCATION

On Wednesday March 1st 2023, Claire Hay alongside Janelle Sztuhar (UFV Library) and Ashley McDougall (VP External, UFV Student Union Society) presented a lightning talk as part of the Open Education Talks 2023 series (<https://oetalks.opened.ca/>). Their talk focused on the important role students play in open education initiatives at UFV.

We talked about the advocacy work of UFV SUS in building awareness among the student population on the role of open education resources to support learning. As Ashley noted in the presentation, very few students know about open education resources and how it can support learning if used in courses. We also presented the ways students have been directly involved in open education initiatives at UFV: as Open Education Student Assistants for the Open Education Faculty Fellows projects which involved faculty projects from Math and Stats (2 projects) and Kinesiology; and, for the Open Education Micro Grants Program for an online linear algebra project in Math and Stats.

TRIBUTE TO MAUREEN WIDEMAN

In the summer of 2022, after almost nine years in Teaching and Learning, I stepped back from leading the department. It was a difficult decision as I loved my team, the work and the many challenges in the role, but in my heart, I knew it was time to step aside. When I arrived at UFV, it was like stepping on to a campus from another era. Only 11 classrooms had any kind of technology. COWs or computers on wheels required faculty members to sign out, pick up and return essential teaching equipment each time they needed it. Classroom set up was fixed, active learning was in its infancy, teaching with technology was viewed suspiciously. Change is difficult, and while uncertainty is always part of the challenge of any teaching and learning centre, working with UFV's academic units and students has been a joy as together we moved forward through transformational changes to learning.

UFV's commitment to students was demonstrated as it quickly responded to demands of COVID and later, the Sumas floods. TLC dedicated itself to ensuring our faculty and students could meet their obligations of effective teaching no matter the circumstances. But after all the disruption over the last few years and with a view looking forward, I have decided to step back to allow a fresh view on how Teaching and Learning can be re-envisioned for the next decade to meet the goals and strategies for UFV. As I ease out of my role at UFV, I look back at my decision to leave my home province and move across the country to BC and this small city where I knew no one. I have to say it was the best decision I ever made - I've met such wonderful people; I feel I have made a contribution, and have had opportunities to collaborate across the school, the province and the country. It is an honour to work here, to live on beautiful Sto:lo land, and support UFV and its community.
