1) Demonstrate information Competency. Students will:

3) Use Knowledge and skills proficiently. Students will:

- Set up an academic plan with an appropriate course load each semester that leads to graduation

4) Initiate inquiries and develop solutions to problems. Students will:

- Learn when it is in their best interest to ask for help or participate in student support services provided on campus
- Come prepared to all advising meetings and will take the initiative to set up additional meetings as needed
- Demonstrate curiosity and the ability to critically evaluate the benefits and challenges of opportunities related to career and/or educational choices

5) Communicate effectively. Students will:

- Ask questions and come prepared for all advising appointments
- Learn to communicate effectively and respectfully regarding educational, career choices and intrinsic motivators by asking pertinent questions and following up on material that is not understood
- Develop a comprehensive and personalized educational plan to successfully achieve goals and select courses each semester to progress toward those goals

6) Pursue self-motivated and self-reflective learning. Students will:

- Set short-term and long-term goals, as well as, take action toward completing such goals
- Demonstrate the ability to communicate an academic plan that demonstrates an alignment between career and personal goals and values
- Develop a comprehensive and personalized educational plan to successfully achieve goals and select courses each semester to progress toward those goals

7) Engage in collaborative leadership. Students will:

- Learn about and understand the importance of leadership opportunities on campus and in the community, as well as seeking opportunities to collaborate
- Be encouraged to develop an appreciation and respect for individual and cultural differences and commonalities
- Connect with and experience co-curricular, or student life activities that encourage collaboration and leadership opportunities

8) Engage in respectful and professional practices. Students will:

- Understand institutional policy as it pertains to individual academic achievement and success
- Demonstrate ownership (take responsibility for) of the academic and career choices that they choose to engage in
- Access the resources and services on campus to help achieve academic, personal, and career goals

9) Contribute regionally and globally. Students will:

- Possess the knowledge to engage in the community regionally or globally via volunteer, work study, practicum, study abroad programs, and/or advocacy efforts
- Know how to access the resources and services available on campus and in the community, in order to achieve academic, personal, and career goals
- Connect with and experience co-curricular, or student life activities that encourage collaboration and leadership opportunities
- Connect with and explore options for degree completion via study abroad, community involvement initiatives as part of research or as service
