2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

- b. Welcome and introductions of Mary Saudelli and Michelle Johnson to the Teaching & Learning Department at UFV.

Mary Saudelli is the new Faculty Development Consultant and she is looking forward to working with the faculty at UFV. She has extensive experience in curriculum development.

Michelle Johnson is the new Educational Developer and she is going to be developing workshops and online modules to help faculty, staff and students with the integration of the Portfolio requirement for the BA program.

- c. New eRoom A233 – Maureen Wideman

Maureen explained that there is a new HP all-in-one touchscreen computer in A233. It is not on a podium but is connected to the wall on an arm which gives it lots of mobility for facilitators who are sitting, standing or in wheelchairs. It has a DVD drive and you can also attach a laptop to it or insert a flash drive. This new computer is meant to be a replacement for the eRoom Lites. Maureen encouraged everyone to take some time and try it out and then send her the feedback.

f. Teaching & Learning Roundtable

- i. Michelle Johnson highlighted a couple teaching and learning tools from her trip to the Blackboard conference in Las Vegas in the summer of 2016:

- Smartboards as large as projector screens with built in microphones and webcams for uploading class discussions in Blackboard.
- Tablet app called Splashtop Classroom with a feature that lets you access your PDF from your iPad, phone or tablet as you walk around your classroom.
- Padlet.com is a new web tool that is for collaboration. It has an embed tool to upload to the Padlet BB courses.

- Took part in a Competency Based Learning session that was asynchronous, self-based, self-directed, and self-assessed.
